

MCFC - General Update

August 8, 2024

Harvesting:

RV Pepper is harvesting on blocks 75 and 76 up the Minnow. Finishing up roughly 18ha from previous logging. Mainly a SPF block. Wood sold to Carrier, Canfor, Gilbert Smith and Cedar3/BKB.

RV Pepper is also harvesting part of MC02. Mountainview is a fair weather only road. If conditions are too wet to operate up the Minnow then Pepper will harvest/haul on MC02.

Warren McLennan has finished harvest on MV02 right of ways. Now harvesting block MC02 road right of way and then block. MC02 is located at 6km on Mountain View FSR. MC02 has been harvested multiple times. We are now cleaning up the Cedar/Hemlock that remains. Wood sold to Canfor, BKB and Cedar3.

Roads:

ORM has completed all works on Minnow ML maintenance, upgrade, construction and deactivation project successfully.

ORM has completed all works on the Pasture Road Blk MV02 road right of way logging, upgrades, construction and deactivation project successfully.

ORM has been awarded contract to upgrade a 4km road into an area with old silviculture liabilities and future blocks. Potentially summer ground. Used this springs tendered rates.

ORM has been awarded contract to build a 1km road into MC02. Used this springs tendered rates.

Bridges: No Activity

Planning/Other:

Shaughnessy Clausen, ORM and RT King are gathering information on all blocks layed out this previous winter. SP data, riparian and general look around to see if we missed anything.

Simpchw FN have been out working on Cultural Heritage assessments.

Sort Yard:

40-50 loads of cedar post and rail and Z grade remaining. We gave BKB OK to start hauling to their yard.

Silviculture:

FG/Stocking surveys should start soon.

Walking overdue FG blocks to make plans.

Recreation:

We are maintaining both LaSalle Lake and Beaver campgrounds.

We are maintaining McBride Peak halfway. Road is open and people are using it.

Recreation crew was in the area and have completed works at Lasalle Lake. Including: new floating dock, brushed trails between lakes, painted outhouses, site maintenance to name a few.
